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Jughead Hat

The Jughead Hat is knit from the top down, using short rows to create those signature points. The majority of the hat is in stockinette, while the garter to the points makes them stand out.

Gauge: 7 Stitches and 11 rows per 2” in stockinette

Supplies:

Worsted Weight Gray Yarn – (Peace Fleece in Rabbit Gray is a great choice!) I used 100 yards on mine.

Set of four size 8 double-pointed needles (or size needed to obtain gauge)

Alongside the dpns you could use a set of 16” size 8 circular needles (or size to obtain gauge)

1 stitch marker



Stitches Abbreviations:

K – Knit

KFB – knit into the front and back of the same stitch

PM – Place Marker

Turn – Turn entire project and knit from the inside of the hat (When turning move yarn to back of project.)



To start:

CO 6 stitches. Join in round. Place marker to mark beginning of row.

Row 1 – KFB around

Row 2 – Knit

Row 3 – (K1, KFB) repeat (18)

Row 4 – Knit

Row 5 – (K2, KFB) repeat (24)

Row 6 – Knit

Row 7 – (K3, KFB) repeat (30)

Row 8 – Knit

Row 9 – (K4, KFB) repeat (36)

Row 10 – Knit

Row 11 – (K5, KFB) repeat (42)

Row 12 – Knit

Row 13 – (K6, KFB) repeat (48)

Row 14 – Knit

Row 15 – (K7, KFB) repeat (54)

Row 16 – Knit

Row 17 – (K8, KFB) repeat (60)

Row 18 – Knit

Row 19 – (K9, KFB) repeat (66)

Knit in stockinette until hat measures 8 inches from top to bottom or desired height. NOTE: At this point in the hat everything else you knit will be the folded points, so make sure the hat is as long as you want it to be before moving on! Hopefully, if you bound the hat off here it would fit you.



Bind off points:

From Beginning of Round Marker –

Knit 1 Stitch, then move to Rows 1-13

Row 1 – Knit 10 stitches, Turn

Row 2 – Knit 10 stitches, Turn

Row 3 – Knit 9 stitches, Turn

Row 4 – Knit 8 stitches, Turn

Row 5 – Knit 7 stitches, Turn

Row 6 – Knit 6, Turn

Row 7 – K5, Turn

Row 8 – K4, Turn

Row 9 – K3, Turn

Row 10 – K2, Turn

Row 11 – K1, Turn

Row 12 – K6, Turn

Row 13 – Bind off: K2, K2TOG, (Knit 1, K2TOG) repeat 10 times

Point number one is complete. Repeat Rows 1-13 for each point until there is only one stitch left on the needles.

Break yarn, weave in ends.

Fold the points upwards for that classic Jughead look.
