Micro Harvest Collection

I woke up one morning with an incredible urge to start knitting micro fruits and vegetables, and a short while later I had a miniscule garden full of them. In this collection you will find micro-knitting patterns for carrots, pumpkins and radishes. After the patterns you'll find a spell to guarantee a good harvest.

Supplies:

Size 0 (2 mm) DPNs

Crochet hook 1.8mm size

Craft Thread in Orange, Red, White and Green

Abbreviations

K – knit

P – purl

KFB – knit into the front and then into the back of the same stitch.



K2TOG – knit 2 stitches together as one.

SSK – Slip, slip, knit. Slip one stitch as if to knit, slip the next stitch as if to purl, knit the 2 together through the back loops.

BO – Bind Off

CO – Cast On

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Carrots:

- 1 – Using Orange CO 1
 - 2 – KFB
 - 3 – K1, KFB
 - 4 – Push all stitches to the opposite end of needle and K3
 - 5 – KFB around and spread stitches over two needles
 - 6-12 – K
- Break yarn and pull through all stitches
Tie off

Using Green yarn cut four pieces of green about 4 inches long.
Thread a piece through the top of the carrot and tie the two ends of it together. Repeat with all pieces. Trim.

Pumpkins:

Body of Pumpkin:

Using orange CO 15 stitches.

Join in the round, distributing over three needles.

Rows 1-6 – K1, P2 around

Using a darning needle pull yarn through the open stitches and pull tight.

Stuff with fiberfill or yarn ends

Using the same string sew up the open end, create a knot. Leave string to attach to earring hooks, stitch markers, etc.

Stem of Pumpkin:

With green CO 2 stitches

Push both stitches to the opposite end of the needle and knit both.

Repeat 2 more times creating a 2 stitch icord that is 3 rows long.

BO and break yarn. Attach to top of pumpkin.

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Radishes:

Radish:

Using White CO 1

1 – K1

2– KFB

3 – K1, KFB

4 – Push all stitches to the other end of the needle and K3

5 – KFB around and separate stitches to three needles

6 – K around

Break white and switch to Red.

7 – KFB around

8 – 13 – K

14 – K2Tog around

Break yarn and using darning needle go back through all stitches.

Pull tight and tie off.

Radish Leaves:

Using Green:

Using Backward Loop Method, CO 5 Stitches

BO 4 stitches (1)

CO 4 stitches (5)

BO 3 stitches

CO 2 stitches

BO all stitches.

Use the end of the thread to tie leaves to top of radish.

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Seedling Spell

This spell accompanies the planting of spring seedlings.

Fill a watering can with water. Set it in a window on a full moon night.

The next morning sprinkle a little water onto each of your seedlings while chanting the following:

From the dirt of earth
And the light of the sun
I pour the waters of a goddess
And light the spark of life within



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
